

ABORIGINAL CARBON FARMING

To achieve the course in Aboriginal Carbon Farming, the participant must complete the skills set which is comprised of three (3) units:

Support Aboriginal carbon farming projects

The nominal duration of the course is 50 hours delivered across five (5) days. A Statement of Attainment will be issued when the course in Aboriginal Carbon Farming is successfully completed.



Entry Requirements

There are no formal prerequisites for this course.

Rangers, Traditional Owners, and Pastoralists who are engaged in a carbon project, or are interested in developing a carbon project, are encouraged to undertake this course. Basic literacy and numeracy to complete this training is satisfactory.

ABOUT COURSE DELIVERY

This training course can be delivered in your community. Training facilities should provide: internet access for carbon farming tools e.g. NAFI and SavBAT. Communities involved in this course must provide 8 – 16 Rangers and/or Traditional Owners. Communities involved in the delivery of this course must provide a suitably qualified and experienced person(s) with expertise and knowledge of local carbon farming methods and practices.
